Dear Sisters and Brothers in our Risen Lord,

As a Church, this is our Easter proclamation. It is the proclamation of our lives as Christians. He is Risen! He is our hope and our salvation. I have been praying for each of you. Everyone's vigilance is crucial whenever we gather.

As we come back together as a community of faith, let us work in unity for the good of everyone. Bear in mind the urging of St. Paul to the Church in Philippi: "Do nothing from selfishness or empty conceit, but with humility of mind regard one another as more important than yourselves; do not merely look out for your own personal interests, but also for the interests of others. Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus..." Philippians 2:3-5. Let us take care of one another.

While the Sunday obligation to participate in Mass continues to be dispensed for the faithful, it is important that we have the opportunity to come together as community and celebrate God's gift of Himself in Holy Communion. These communal moments are moments we are to gather with the Crucified and Risen Savior.

I am remembering you in my prayers and Masses I offer daily.
